NOMINATION CRITERIA

(Deadline for Nomination Form: March 27, 2009)

The Educational Opportunity Program/Advancement on Individual Merit (EOP/AIM) recognizes students who have exemplified the goals of the program and have excelled in the areas of academics, athletics, community service, and student leadership.

EOP/AIM students may be nominated for the following awards using the criteria as stated below:

ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

Athletics: Presented annually to EOP/AIM students in good academic standing who have made significant contributions to the University in the area of athletics.

Community Service: Presented annually to EOP/AIM students in good academic standing who have made significant contributions to the University in the area of community service.

Student Leadership: Presented annually to EOP/AIM students in good academic standing who have made significant contributions to the University in the area of student leadership.

Outstanding Freshmen, Sophomore, Junior & Senior Awards:

Presented annually to EOP/AIM who has maintained a cumulative grade point average of 2.8, is in good standing with the EOP/AIM program (ie: attended mandatory meetings, satisfactory in First Year Seminar 101), and has made significant contributions to the University during their freshman/sophomore/junior/senior year.

Outstanding Transfer:

Presented to an EOP/AIM fall 2008 transfer student who has maintained a cumulative grade point average of 2.8, is in good standing with the EOP/AIM program (ie: attended mandatory meetings, satisfactory in SBU 101), and have made significant contributions to the University during their first semester/year at the University.

JAMES NOBLES MEMORIAL AWARD:

A Scholarship Award presented annually to an EOP/AIM junior or senior who has earned at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA and has made a significant contribution to campus life, and exhibits the characteristics of the work and leadership James Nobles exemplified during his tenure at Stony Brook University.

Mr. Nobles worked tirelessly for EOP/AIM for many years, significantly contributing to the program's success. He provided unparalleled leadership to EOP/AIM during periods of fiscal difficulty. Mr. Nobles was a proponent of personal excellence, and provided a beacon of hope to those students experiencing personal difficulties. Mr. Nobles served on the Student Administrative Services Committee, the Committee on Academic Standing and Appeals, the Undergraduate Excellence Award Committee, the Dr. Martin Luther King Celebration Committee, and the Committee to Celebrate Diversity. James held positions of Counselor, Associate Director and Acting Director of EOP/AIM.
